<u>April 20</u>: Zoom-based Virginia Baptist Disaster Response Training begins today!

COVID-19 has presented challenges and opportunities for training and serving with our BGAV Disaster Response. They have been, and continue, to partner with Henrico County to serve the community by cooking two meals a day from the mobile feeding unit to feed the medical and support staff members who are administering COVID-19 vaccinations at the Richmond Raceway. You can train online and try ministry without having to travel out of state or "jump into the deep end" of a typical response. You can take the online Introduction to Disaster Response and Introduction to Mass Feeding. The "hands on" portion of your training happens at the raceway as you serve (observing COVID-19 protocol). You can serve for one day or for a week at a time. Housing is provided free of charge to out of town volunteers at Mechanicsville Baptist Church. Crisis Care Team volunteers have also been serving alongside our feeding team to care for the emotional and spiritual need of vaccination staff members and those receiving vaccines. If you are interested in training to serve with this team, the Zoombased, six-week course will be available every Tuesday at 2:00 PM. starting April 20 and ending May 25. RESCUE THE VICTIMS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Are you aware that 100 young people are rescued from human trafficking each year in the region from Washington, DC, to Florida? According to Safe House Project, those 100 represent about 1% of the children and teens caught in the trap of the traffickers in this region. The Bridge Network of Churches, an organization located in Chesapeake, VA, contacted Safe House to see what would help facilitate these rescues. A suitcase filled with basic necessities is needed for each child/teen that is rescued. Additionally, the cost for emergency needs of each rescue is \$200.00. The Bridge Network's goal is 100 suitcases and \$20,000 (for 100 rescues) by **May 10, 2021**!

If you or your church would like to commit to purchasing a new suitcase and filling it with the requested items (about \$150) AND contribute \$200, your donation could save a child/teen from the ravages of human trafficking. A new 24" suitcase will be purchased and filled with the following items: Pillow with pillow case, soft blanket, towel and washcloth, full size shampoo and conditioner, full size toothbrush and toothpaste, full size soap, deodorant, feminine hygiene products, and a \$25 Walmart gift card to purchase a new set of clothes. Jesus Has Risen - Mark 16:1-20 (NIV)

When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go to anoint Jesus' body. ² Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb ³ and they asked each other, "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?" ⁴ But when they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had been rolled away. ⁵ As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed. ⁶ "Don't be alarmed," he said. "You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. **He has risen! He is not here.** See the place where they laid him. ⁷ But go, tell his disciples and Peter. 'He is

risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. ⁷ But go, tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you.'" ⁸ Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid. [a]

⁹When Jesus rose early on the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom he had driven seven demons. ¹⁰ She went and told those who had been with him and who were mourning and weeping. 11 When they heard that Jesus was alive and that she had seen him, they did not believe it. ¹² Afterward Jesus appeared in a different form to two of them while they were walking in the country. ¹³ These returned and reported it to the rest; but they did not believe them either. ¹⁴ Later Jesus appeared to the Eleven as they were eating; he rebuked them for their lack of faith and their stubborn refusal to believe those who had seen him after he had risen. ¹⁵ He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation. 16 Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned. ¹⁷ And these signs will accompany those who believe: In my name they will drive out demons; they will speak in new tongues; ¹⁸ they will pick up snakes with their hands; and when they drink deadly poison, it will not hurt them at all; they will place their hands on sick people, and they will get well." 19 After the Lord Jesus had spoken to them, he was taken up into heaven and he sat at the right hand of God. 20 Then the disciples went out and preached everywhere, and the Lord worked with them and confirmed his word by the signs that accompanied it.
