THE "GATHERING" CHURCH

Options for worship and gathering continue to change.
Updates below as provided.

ANTIOCH (SCOTTSVILLE) holds indoor services at 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM. Nursery and Kids Alive are available for the 11 AM service only. CDC guidelines are observed: Attendees must register prior to the service they will attend. Deacons/Security will usher folks to a row. Rows are 6 feet apart, with families seated together. Cleaning is completed between the services. Each service is limited to 100 people. Masks are required. Congregants are asked to enter by the back doors and exit to the front left or down the right hall. Deacon/Security will facilitate departure releasing rows from the front first. Drinking fountains have been blocked off and kitchen, Sunday School classrooms, and the youth room are closed.

CEDAR continues to have Worship Service in the church sanctuary on Sunday mornings at 10:00 AM. Anyone attending will be asked to comply with the safety ordinances. The service will also be available at the same time over the radio at 87.9 for anyone preferring to remain in their vehicles in the parking lot and also on Facebook Live. Currently there is no Sunday School.

FIRST BAPTIST DILLWYN continues to worship at 11:00 AM each Sunday. While they could not attend in person due to inclement weather on February 7 & 14, very meaningful services were conducted by Pastor John Moxley, Pianist Cody Moss, Choir Director Kristye Moxley, and Children's Director Jennifer Taylor. These services blessed many who received them clearly through radio station FM 92.9. Prayer Meeting and Choir Practice continue on Wednesday nights as weather permits. Sunday School was canceled on the first two Sundays of February, but resumed on February 21, with the study of I Corinthians for all adults.

ANTIOCH (SCOTTSVILLE) continues their Shield-A-Badge Appreciation Program. For the month of February they honored Earl Schoen of Lake Monticello Police Department. The 5 Loaves and 2 Fish Ministry distributed food to many families on February 27. They also prepared boxes for Hope for Appalachia and made a monetary donation.

BUCKINGHAM is filling baby bottles with change/money for the Pregnancy Center. They participated in Rise Against Hunger and prepared boxes for Hope.

CEDAR prepared boxes for Hope and continue to collect for Rise Against Hunger.

CHESTNUT GROVE collected for Rise Against Hunger and prepared boxes for Hope.

FIRST BAPTIST DILLWYN was honored to host the Red Cross Bloodmobile on Thursday, February 7. 46 units of blood were given to bless many lives during very difficult days. The Helping Hands Ministry sent Valentine cards to over 50 persons, led church members to prepare homemade soup and deliver it to about 65 individuals who are lonely on Sunday, February 21, made goodie baskets for people who are experiencing difficult situations, and made many phone calls and visited the sick, shut-ins, and others of the area. They prepared boxes for Hope and collected for Rise Against Hunger.

JONES CHAPEL sent a \$1,000 donation to Hope for Appalachia since they did not prepare boxes due to the pandemic. They are also collecting for Rise Against Hunger.

MULBERRY GROVE donated to Rise Against Hunger and individuals worked on Hope for Appalachia boxes. Wayne Gough will be a part of the delivery team to Kentucky. Members contributed to a church member's family who lost everything in a fire in Kentucky. The outreach ministry continues with cards, calls, food, and the delivery of church literature. Members volunteer on a regular basis at the bimonthly food distribution at Crystal Cathedral. In March, the church will focus on the Annie Armstrong Offering for North American Missions. It will also make monetary donations to assist with the purchase of leg braces for a six year old child in Jamaica who has local connections.

SHARON is collecting for Rise Against Hunger (February/March) and prepared Hope boxes (+other items). They donated \$180 to the JRBA Hope effort as well. Rose of Sharon WMU gave Valentines to the residents and staff of Heritage Hall, and continues providing meals, sending cards, phoning, and making porch visits to those who are sick, homebound, or just need to see a friendly face.

JRBA Quarterly Executive Board Meeting January 11, 2021

Mrs. Marilyn Snoddy, Moderator, opened the meeting by sharing a devotional on Job 19:25, I know that my Redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand upon the earth. As we think about our own faith during this difficult time of pandemic, we know that we can plead the blood of Jesus as our salvation, but Job didn't know about Jesus and His saving grace and resurrection. Job believed by FAITH! And we see that he also believed in the second coming even though the first had not occurred. None of us know what is going to happen with COVID, with the unsettling political situation, and so much violence throughout the world – so, we must hold on to faith that our Redeemer lives and that he WILL stand in the end. Marilyn ended her devotional with a prayer asking God to help us stand firm in our faith and that we can be faithful like Job. She prayed for God's presence and guidance during our meeting and gave Him glory and praise for all that we accomplish together.

Marilyn then called the meeting to order and Frank Breault, Clerk, had the roll call of churches. There were 23 in attendance, representing 11 member churches.

The minutes of the October, 2020, Executive Board Meeting were presented and approved. The Treasurer's Quarterly Report was presented by Judy Ownby. As of December 31. 2020, the checking account balance was \$35,933.04, which included the following: Additional Missions Fund - \$900.00, Mission Trips - \$2,350.00, Rise Against Hunger - \$6.607.00, Missions Blitz -\$1,176.21, Bland Ministry Center - \$500.00, Christian Education/Training/Evangelism - \$500.00, and Baccalaureates - \$400.00. Total Disbursements for the quarter were \$5,637.11 which included Missions Trips -\$150.00, Additional Missions - \$700.00 (Pregnancy Support Center, Baptist Collegiate Ministry, Grace Inside, The Gideons, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, BGAV Disaster Relief, and Piedmont Habitat for Humanity - \$100 each), Missions Blitz - \$48.79, Virginia Historical Society Annual Dues - \$50.00, CNA Surety Bond Insurance - \$484.78, and all other regular expenses. Total receipts for the guarter were \$4,386.16, which included church contributions of \$4.374.25, \$7.25 from AmazonSmile.com, and \$4.66 interest on the checking account. The Savings Account Balance is \$4,315.40. The report was approved as presented.

Next, Marilyn gave the Moderator's Report with a big shout out to all who either went or donated items to our Fall Winterwear Collection for Hope for Appalachia. She

also expressed appreciation to Rev. Michael Khol for heading up the Missions Blitz work done in 2020. She mentioned several ways the Buckingham County School teachers/staff had been ministered to by individual churches. Mrs. Betty Toney then presented the John E. Mann, Sr. Benevolence Fund Quarterly Report. During the past quarter, four individuals or families were assisted the overdue electric bills, two individuals were provided one night's emergency lodging, and one individual was assisted with fuel for heating. Buckingham, Cedar, First Baptist Dillwyn, and Sharon made contributions to the fund totaling \$1,370.00. Available funds (12/31/20) were \$6,952.28. Betty also presented some information from JRBA WMU. She noted that the JRBA WMU is going to receive 50 baby bottles from the Southside Pregnancy Center to collect donations. If any WMU or church would like to utilize some of the baby bottles, please contact her.

Rev. Woody Moore, Disaster Response Coordinator, asked for prayer for a DR volunteer, Ryan Celluar, from Grundy, VA. Mr. Celluar is a faithful DR volunteer and is always helping others. He is experiencing health issues at this time.

Rev. Jimmy Dunn addressed the Board on behalf of the Missions Committee. He noted that since we cannot at this time, or in the forseeable future, host a Rise Against Hunger meal packing event, the Committee makes a motion to contribute to RAH's COVID-19 option of procuring food through partners in various countries where it will then be distributed to those in need. This will not only get food to those who are hungry, but by the food being purchased locally, it will stimulate the economy in those settings. The motion was approved. There is currently \$6,607.00 in designated funds. The committee also recommended that we extend collection of RAH funds until February 17, 2021, so that churches that did not participate will have the opportunity to do so. The Board concurred. Rev. Dunn asked that everyone encourage our churches to give to this worthy cause. Rev. Woody Moore, Hope for Appalachia Regional and JRBA Team Leader, expressed his appreciation for all that our churches have done for the schools in Kentucky. He noted that the Fall trip was hard as they could not see the children or work with the other missionaries. He thanked Rev. Anthony Saaco and Buckingham Baptist for providing meals for the entire team. He noted that due to the restrictions of the pandemic, additional team members will not be sought for the spring delivery. He, Rev. Roger Woody, and Wayne Gough will make the delivery. The trip is planned for March 29 - April 3. A packet of information was distributed with directions for preparing Hope boxes, labels, etc. Woody noted a couple of things: He asked that everyone please follow the guidelines. He also reminded us not to include any

candy or food items IN the Hope boxes. He asked that each church be sure to keep a count of what is sent and give those numbers to both him and Phyllis so that we can have an accurate total count. Woody then noted that prayer is coveted for this effort, for the volunteers, the children, and the schools. Rev. Michael Khol noted that he had recently sent out an email about Missions Blitz projects. One ramp was completed by a team from Antioch (Scottsville) and himself; Buckingham and Mulberry Grove have each taken a project. There is not a larger project in the works, but he is hopeful that we can continue to utilize the funds already donated to continue to do small projects that will impact lives in our communities. He thanked the churches for their donations and will extend a request when more funds are needed.

Under Old Business, a motion was made, seconded, and approved for JRBA to "Re-Adopt" Bell Central Elementary School for 2021 through Hope for Appalachia. Val Breault asked how many students attend and Woody noted that we would need somewhere around 530 boxes. Actual numbers are not yet available.

Under New Business, Marilyn noted that the Program Committee asked for guidance on the scheduling of the JRBA Semi-Annual Spring Meeting that is scheduled for May 13, 2021, at Goshen Baptist, in lieu of the pandemic. She noted that the meeting does take a lot of preparation and a decision needed to be made. Goshen representatives noted that Goshen would not be large enough to provide for social distancing. Gloria Newton, Antioch (Scottsville) noted that they had enough space to accommodate the restrictions. Gwynn Tyler noted that with the increased cases of COVID-19 locally and the questions surrounding when vaccines would be available to the general public, he didn't think scheduling the meeting would be wise. He noted that hosting a virtual meeting was a possibility if anyone wanted to provide the expertise. After some discussion, Gwynn made a motion that the Semi-Annual Spring Meeting be canceled. It was seconded and approved. Marilyn then asked Austin Williams, BCM Interim Campus Minister, if he had an update. He noted that students went home before Thanksgiving, but had returned. Due to the new COVID-19 restrictions, gatherings are prohibited for more than 10 persons so they are making adjustments in scheduling Bible Study groups, etc.

Rev. Michael Khol made a motion to adjourn and Rev. Henry Enochs closed the meeting with prayer.
