V.B.S. Follow-Up

ANTIOCH (Scottsville): VBS was a success! It was held for newborns to adults on June 28 – July 2, outdoors, from 6:30 – 8:30 PM. There were 27 volunteers and 137 participants throughout the week. It featured a daily Bible story, snacks, music, crafts, and recreation, centered around the theme, *Concrete and Cranes*. Jessica Partusch was the director.

BUCKINGHAM: VBS materials were delivered on July 13 – 16, to children in the neighborhood. The parents are sending in pictures of the children working and enjoying the activities.

CEDAR: A total of 92 children, ages 4 through those having completed 5th grade, were enrolled in VBS. There will be another day set aside for VBS for youth in Middle and High School after school starts.

JRBA Quarterly Executive Board Meeting July 12, 2021

Mrs. Marilyn Snoddy, Moderator. opened the meeting by sharing a devotional on II Timothy 4:7: I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. This VBS theme verse reminds us to remain faithful. We do not wrestle with flesh and blood, but with evil. The root of problems is evil and it is a daily fight to keep our thoughts and actions in line with God's will. Satan twisted God's word with Eve in the Garden of Eden. He's alsway trying to get us to ruin our testimony, but we must fight the good fight. It is easy to be strong at the beginning of a race, but we must persevere. Think about the acronym, HALT: don't let yourself get: Hungry, Angry, Lonely, or Tired – as you go through the race. Remember you must keep your body mentally, spiritually and physically strong. And be aware that people on the sidelines can help you with the race. We need to surround ourselves with God's people to help us. We must keep God in our hearts and minds and allow Jesus to guide us so that when we finish the race, we will be able to say: I have fought the good fight, I have run a good race, and I have remained faithful! Marilyn then prayed for us to be faithful and to run a good race as well as for God's guidance as we work together as an Association.

Marilyn called the meeting to order and Frank Breault, Clerk, had the roll call of churches. There were 20 in attendance, representing 11 churches with one visitor.

The minutes of the Apri Executive Board Meeting were presented and approved. The Treasurer's Quarterly Report was presented by Judy Ownby. As of June 30, 2021, the checking account balance was \$31,141.74, which included the following: Additional Missions – \$900.00, Rise Against Hunger - \$90.00, Mission Trips - \$2,000.00, and Missions Blitz - \$345.39. Total receipts for the quarter were \$5,848.96, which included: Church Contributions - \$2,738.62, Individual & Other (Amazon Smile) - \$5.00, Rise Against Hunger - \$90.00, Interest on checking - \$4.55, and Bland (Churches & individuals) - \$2,337.10. Total disbursements for the quarter were \$22,243.50, which included: Mission Trips (Jones Chapel & FBC) - \$200.00, Rise Against Hunger - \$12,686.65, Annual Insurance Payment - \$435.00, Bland Ministry Center - \$3,387.10, Missions Blitz - \$989.37, and Baccalaureate (Fluvanna & Buckingham) - \$400.00. The Savings account Balance was \$4,333.71. The report was approved as presented.

Mrs. Betty Toney presented the John E. Mann, Sr. Emergency Benevolence Fund Report. From April 1 – June 30, there were no requests for assistance. An expenditure of \$50.00 was made to Mulberry Grove's Benevolence Fund in memory of Valeria Breault. Total contributions for the quarter were \$250.00 from Buckingham Baptist and Chestnut Grove WMU. The balance on hand stoo at \$7,797.28.

Next, Marilyn gave her Moderator's Report, emphasizing how our churches are resuming more and more of their regular activities. She noted that 12 churches hosted, or are planning to host VBS, and at least 9 of our churches are planning Homecomings and/or Revivals. She congratulated Buckingham Baptist on their 250th Anniversary, celebrated on July 11. A moment of silence was observed in memory of two faithful servants who passed away during June: Mrs. Valeria Breault and Mrs. Betty Jude. Marilyn acknowledged the recent pastoral changes in our churches: Josh Cook is a Pastoral Intern at Antioch Union; Rev. Alan Gough is the Interim Pastor at Tar Wallet and just became ordained into the Gospel ministry; Rev. Roger Woody resigned as pastor of Chestnut Grove and Rev. John Moxley has resigned as pastor of First Baptist Dillwyn. Both of these pastors remain on our JRBA Supply List. Marilyn reminded us that our 188th Annual Fall Meeting will be held on Thursday, October 21, with the business session beginning at 6:30 PM followed by worship at 7:15

PM. There will not be a fellowship meal. The Program Committee will notify the churches as soon as a location is set. Marilyn also notes that plans are moving forward for our Hope for Appalachia fall trip to Kentucky. She emphasized the importance of churches preparing Kindergarten bags for the schools there. She also noted that Band-Aids are being collected for the school. These items can be brought to the Annual Fall Meeting or dropped off at the JRBA Office.

Marilyn then shared a letter to the Association from Gladstone Memorial. They are experiencing some financial struggles as a result of COVID-19 and a congregation mostly on fixed incomes. As a result, they have had to make adjustments to their budget and cannot, at the present time, continue to financially support JRBA. They pledged their prayers and the hope of getting back on a more firm financial standing and being able to reinstate their Associational Missions budget. Rev. Jimmy Dunn requested that a letter be sent assuring Gladstone that JRBA appreciates their financial faithfulness through the years, that financial contributions are not necessary to JRBA membership, and that we will pray for them. A motion was made, seconded, and unanimously passed to send them a love gift of \$500.00.

Rev. Skip Wallace, BGAV Field Strategist, thanks JRBA for the support of Gladstone, noting that this action exemplifies what "association" is all about. He gave information on the upcoming BGAV Annual Meeting. It is to be held November 9-10, in-person at Eagle Eyrie and virtually online. Voting is only in-person, but those who cannot attend can join via the Internet. The schedule should be available sometime around August 1, along with registration and lodging information. The Pastors' Conference will include spouses this year and will take place on Monday, November 8, in and around Eagle Eyrie. It is to be a fun day, possibly including fishing, hiking, golfing, painting, etc. A worship service will be held on Monday night.

The following officers' reports were given:

- WMU (Betty Toney): The WMU hasn't been as active in recent months due to COVID-19. Several churches helped with graduate cards/bags and gave to the prom efforts. The JRBA WMU made a contribution to the WMU Vision Fund.
- Disaster Response (Rev. Woody Moore): The BGAV
 Disaster Response continues to be involved with cleanup in
 St. Charles, LA. Training continues to be available online.
 Folks who would like to serve can also receive training onsite. The Crisist Care Teams have grown. There are many opportunities for both chaplains and others to serve in this capacity. If you cannot go, please pray for the effort of both the Crisis Care Team and the Feeding and Cleanup teams.
- Hope for Appalachia (Rev. Woody Moore): The fall trip will be the first week of December. If anyone is interested in being a part of the team, you can go online to the Hope for Appalachia Virginia page and apply. You can request to be on Woody's team. There will be room for 8 - 10 (Woody, Roger Woody, and Wayne Gough are already signed up). You must have a background check (done during the 2021 -2022 school year). Members of the team will also be checked when they arrive at the school. Donations for the school should be brought to Mt. Zion, Tar Wallet, or the JRBA office by November 3. Gently-used or New Items being collected include: Coats, Hats, Gloves, Individual Blanikets, Kindergarten bags, and band-aids. Monetary donations can be made towards Woody's purchase of a trailer (for hauling donations to Kentucky) or to help provide Christmas gifts for needy children in the schools. Woody thanked the churches for their continuing support of HFA.
- Pastors' Huddle (Rev. Michael Khol): Michael encouraged pastors to attend the monthly gatherings. It is a time to encourage and support one another. Churches have been struggling and it is important to help one another and share one another's burdens. The Huddle meets every 3rd
 Wednesday at First Baptist Dillwyn at noon.

The following committee reports were given:

- Missions (Rev. Jimmy Dunn): Jimmy thanked churches that assisted Brown's Chapel with their mission trip to Restoration Ministries in Matoaka, WV, and noted that they plan another trip there in October. He is grateful that we are continuing to give to Rise Against Hunger. He noted what a blessing it is to help with the Blue Ridge Food distribution and encouraged others to participate. He thanked Michael for heading up that effort. He thanked the churches involved with COVID-19 clinics and blood drives. He thanked everyone for their support of the Bland Ministry Center. He noted that two youth groups are going on mission trips this summer and asked us to pray for them and their leaders. Jimmy also asked us to be generous in our giving to Hope for Appalachia.
- Mission Blitz (Rev. Michael Khol): Michael noted that Antioch had completed a project in December, Brown's Chapel had completed a project for which we supplied funds, and Mulberry Grove did a project. Lumber is quite expensive so our fund is down to \$345. He finds working together on these projects a fun way to help people together. He plans a big push in September to reach out in our communities and help folks.
- Baccalaureate (Written reports from Buckingham, Cumberland, and Fluvanna): Michelle Wright thanked the churches that participated in the card shower for Buckingham graduates or who made a monetary donation. She also thanked JRBA for the \$200 towards the purchase of the indivdiual cupcakes for the seniors' bags. Rev. Barry Vassar reported that no baccalaureate was scheduled this year for the Cumberland graduates, but will hopefully resume next year. Gloria Newton reported that Antioch prepared about 260 bags for Fluvanna graduates and thanked JRBA for their \$200 contribution towards the purchase of mugs for the graduates' bags.
- Sunday School (Rev. Jimmy Dunn): Jimmy noted his appreciation of churches hosting VBS this summer and asked that churches follow-up and try to get the children in Sunday School.

There was no Old Business. Under New Business, Rev. Michael Khol made a motion to reschedule the October Quarterly Executive Board Meeting to October 4, 2021. The motion was seconded, and approved.

The Moderator reminded everyone of the various upcoming VBSs, Homecomings, and Revivals listed on the Announcement page and asked everyone to remember the youth from Jones Chapel and First Baptist going on mission trips. Audrey Ragland reminded everyone of the Sharon Baptist Fellowship Hall Dedication scheduled for July 18. Gary Clore closed the meeting with prayer.
