PLEASE NOTE THESE JRBA SCHEDULE CHANGES

The JRBA Quarterly Executive Board Meeting scheduled for Monday, October 4, 2021, has been CANCELED. (Please note that the meeting has previously been moved to October 4 instead of October 11.) JRBA Leadership feels it prudent to cancel due to the increasing number of Covid cases in our area. Two items of business need to be voted on by Executive Board members via email, phone calls, or through the mail.

- 1. A recommendation from the JRBA Program Committee was sent to the Executive Board members on September 7. The committee recommended that the JRBA Annual Fall Meeting scheduled for Thursday, October 21, 2021, be CANCELED due to the ongoing Covid-19 Pandemic. Pastors, Officers, Committee Chairs, and Church Representatives (total of 40 people) were polled on the recommendation. Twenty-six votes were received (representing 14 churches). Twenty-five voted YES (to cancel the meeting) and one voted NO (to hold the meeting). The JRBA Annual Fall Meeting has, therefore, been CANCELED.
- The Finance Committee will be sending out a Proposed Budget for 2021-2022 for approval by the Executive Board. Executive Board members will be polled as they were for the Program Committee recommendation. Results will be sent to the member churches and reported in the November newsletter, along with a copy of the new budget.

MULBERRY GROVE: Members continue to contribute to the Alma Hunt Offering for State Missions. Members have donated 10 Kindergarten bags containing toothbrushes, toothpaste, coloring books, crayons, markers, pencil sharpeners, small toys, and hats for Hope for Appalachia. They also donated 47 boxes of Band Aids for Hope.

MT. ZION: A meal was provided for Longwood BCM on September 6 – the group has gotten very small – please pray for these young people to get involved with this very important ministry. The WMU gave \$500 to this year's Christmas in August project, "Pack A Box". There were different ministries to choose from and the WMU chose to send a monetary gift so the pastor in Indiana can buy wool socks, hats, hygiene supplies, and other things for the homeless there. The ladies thought rather than spend to ship, the pastor would be able to buy more with the donation there! Mt. Zion held a 9/11 Service to remember those who went through the horror of that day and the first responders. They prayed for those who are still living that day, 20 years later. They also prayed for first responders and military persons that put their life on the line to help us daily. Mt. Zion is collecting for the Alma Hunt State Missions Offering. Mt. Zion's Sewing Ministry donated 16 fleece blankets for the bunk beds that had been donated to the Restoration Ministry center. Dorothy Davis and two of the GA girls, Kaylee and Kholoe Snoddy, and their mom, Leslie Snoddy, and Barbara Sn oddy participated in the "Walk for Life" on September 11, in Dillwyn. They walked through Main Street and then to the Pregnancy Support Center, where they were given a tour of the center and told about all the support given to the mothers who choose Life for their babies. They also learned that Wesley

Yoder is now counseling the single fathers. (Support this ministry and spread the word about the office in Dillwyn.)
