

Mission Trip to Matoaka, WV October 7 – 10, 2021

Brown's Chapel will be sponsoring a mission trip to Matoaka, WV, on October 7 – 10, 2021. **Volunteers** are needed for the trip, especially men with carpentry skills. They may work in the clothes closet or help distribute winter coats, hats, gloves, and blankets. Restoration Ministries plans to host a carnival-like event on Saturday, October 9, for the community. There will be games with prizes for the children and brown beans and cornbread will be served. Brown's Chapel is collecting **cans of soup** for the Food Pantry at Restoration Ministries.
