UPDATE ON PREGNANCY SUPPORT CENTER

Some of the JRBA churches were supporters of the Southside Pregnancy Support Center in 2021. Some participated in the Walk for Life and others participated in the Baby Bottle Drive, collecting change to contribute to the center. Here are some updates from the center to let you know how your \$\$ made a difference!

The Walk for Life events were a huge success! The fundraising goal of \$50,000 was met by sponsors and donors. Approximately 440 walkers participated and over 25 volunteers came out to help in any way needed. PSC extends their thanks to all - prayer warriors, supporters, donors, volunteers – for supporting them and LIFE in our community.



Through funds raised in 2021, 96 individuals benefited from your support. Additionally, there were 552 client visits. Four babies were born to clients and 31 pregnancy tests were provided. The work of the center is making a difference in our area! PSC now serves Appomattox, Amelia, Buckingham, Charlotte, Cumberland, Lunenburg, Nottoway, and Prince Edward counties.

The staff of PSC Farmville invites you to come tour the office to see the medical clinic featuring a brand new ultrasound machine. They are also available to come to visit your church and give an update of all the Lord is doing in and through the PSC. Call 434-391-1011 to schedule a tour or request a speaker.



CHURCH OUTREACH

ANTIOCH (SCOTTSVILLE): The Loaves and Fish Ministry was held on December 18, and provided food boxes to many families. The children of the church presented their Christmas program, *Miracle on Main Street*, to the contregation of Mt. Eagle Baptist Church, Charlottesville, on December 19. Antioch continues its "Shield-A-Badge" program – their police officer for December was Jeanne Kotowski of the Lake Monticello Police Department – they covered her in prayer on a daily basis. The Awana Kids collected \$261.50 for God's Pit Crew, that helps families by providing "blessing buckets" during a disaster.

CEDAR: Once again through the wonderful generosity of the church family, the Women on Mission have been able to bless several families for Christmas. Their Angel Tree represented 7 families with 84 "angels" on the tree for 12 children. Cedar feels THEY are receiving the blessings by being able to do this!

FIRST BAPTIST DILLWYN: The church family contributed \$290.00 for Virginia Baptist Disaster Response efforts in areas affected by recent tornadoes.

JONES CHAPEL: The Outreach Team got together and packed Christmas bags for each of the 60 residents of Heritage Hall in Dillwyn. Bags were filled with hygiene items, socks, fun items, cookies and candy, and a stuffed animal for each resident. Members brought in many household items, diapers, gift cards and \$800 in donations to assist a family (husband, wife, and infant) involved in a car accident. Their prayers will continue for this family as they will be recovering from severe injuries over the next few months. The Youth Group went shopping for kids' toys after doing yard work at the church. After contributing the toys to the Cumberland Christmas Mother project, the youth toured "Lights on the Lake" at Bear Creek Lake, where they had a display. Their display won 2nd Place for the event.


