

#### March 2 ASH WEDNESDAY

The early church had many different ways of fasting before Easter. The 40 days of Lent we know now evolved around the time of the Council of Licea, in A.D. 325. <u>Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent</u>. The Ashes came from the previous year's blessed Palm Sunday fronds. They are sprinkled with water and scented with incense. Ashes symbolize grief that we have sinned. Ancient Jews, Ninevites, and early Christians all used ashes as a sign of penance. The ash also symbolizes the dust from which God made us. Let us begin to prepare for Easter on Ash Wednesday.

#### **CHURCH OUTREACH**

**First Baptist Dillwyn:** Helping Hands recently gave gifts to the four Buckingham County fire departments to show deep appreciation for their dedicated service during difficult times. They sent over 60 cards to the sick, shut-in, and bereaved persons of the church and area. Many gas cards, fruit baskets, goodie baskets, and cash gifts were given to individuals with special needs. Plans are being made to prepare and deliver soup lunches to many shut-ins and others on Sunday, February 20. FBC church members have continued to visit many members in their homes and in care facilities. Rev. Glynn Coleman, Interim Pastor, continues to minister to the congregation through his living out the love of Jesus, through his visits and phone calls to those in need, and through services weekly on the radio and Facebook so shut-ins can worship with them.

### JRBA Quarterly Executive Board Meeting

January 10, 2022

Rev. Michael Khol, Moderator, opened the meeting with prayer. He then shared a devotional on John 13.34: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. Jesus is raising the bar! One should mean it when using the word "love". The times we've experienced for the past two years have been hard. We need to work TOGETHER to do more - this is not a new idea, but a new challenge for these times. Churches and people are hurting. Many are suffering from depression and/or drug addiction. This is an opportunity to think and act differently to reach those who are in need. We need to be creative and work together. Are we going to give up or fight? We may need to do things differently, but move forward in the Lord's work. Be prudent and wise. I have hope for JRBA as we look forward and put life back into our association. Look for what the Lord has for us to do. Churches need to set aside differencec and work together as our motto says: Accomplishing Together What We Cannot Do Alone. I am happy to serve as your Moderator and to move forward with the Lord's work!

Michael then called the meeting to order and asked for the Roll Call of Churches. Frank Breault, Clerk, did the roll call – there were 13 in attendance representing 7 churches.

The minutes of the July, 2021, meeting were presented and approved. The Treasurer's Quarterly report was presented and approved. As of December 31, 2021, the checking account balance was \$30,134.24, which included the following: Additional Missions - \$900, Mission Trips - \$2,250, Rise Against Hunger - \$1,504.00, Missions Blitz - \$595.39, Bland - \$500, Christian Education/Training/Evangellism - \$500, and Baccalaureates - \$600. Total receipts for the quarter were \$8.946.06 which included: Church Contributions = \$7,877.75, Amazonsmile.com - \$9.36, Interest on checking - \$3.95, HOPE donations - \$196, Rise Against Hunger donations - \$709, Donation to individual in need -\$150, and HOPE Mission Trip donations of \$196. Total Disbursements for the quarter were \$5,377.66 which included: Missions Trips (Woody Moore, Wayne Gough, and Roger Woody (HOPE), and Malcolm Warfield -(SEEDS) - \$446, Additional Missions - \$700 (Pregnancy Support Center, Baptist Collegiate Ministry, Grace Inside, The Gideons, South Central Virginia Fellowship of Christian Athletes, BGAV Disaster Relief, and Piedmont Habitat for Humanity), VA Baptist Historical Society dues - \$50, and donation to individual in need(designated gift) - \$150. The Savings Account Balance was \$4,352.19

Next, Rev. Michael Khol presented his Moderator's Report. He officially welcomed Rev. Glynn Coleman as the Interim Pastor at First Baptist, Dillwyn, and noted that Rev. John Moxley, Rev. Roger Woody, and Rev. Anthony Saaco had left since our last gathering. He announced that Josh Cook was ordained into the Gospel Ministry at Antioch Union. Mulberry Grove ordained Rev. Austin Williams into the Gospel Ministry as well. He noted that lots of homecomings and revivals had been held since we last met. He expressed thankfulness for all the items donated for the Fall, 2021, Hope for Appalachia winter drive. He mentioned that several churches had participated in making shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child and supported the Alma Hunt and Lottie Moon offerings. He noted that everyone can always go back to the JRBA website and peruse the newsletters to see what has been accomplished. He also mentioned that several people had participated in the 2021 Virtual BGAV Annual Meeting in November. Michael is hopeful that JRBA can meet together more and take steps to do more together in the coming year. He mentioned the possibility of a conference for the churches in 2022 and asked for prayer for that

endeavor. We need to be intentional in planning to get together as the pandemic allows.

#### OTHER OFFICERS' REPORTS:

**WMU** (Betty Toney, Director) – The WMUV annual meeting was also held virtually. It was well attended and well done. Betty requested prayer for Mrs. Gillespie whose husband passed away in December. She expressed hopes that the WMU can do more as conditions improve. She encouraged us all to continue to participate in mission projects.

Committee Reports:

**BENEVOLENCE FUND** (Betty Toney, Chair) – During the past quarter, one individual was assisted with an overdue electric bill; a family of 8 Amish children who lost both their parents in an accident received a monetary donation; memorial flowers were sent in memory of Dorothy Jones, former JRBA Moderator and mother our our WMU Director. Total Disbursements: \$294.00 Church designated contributions from Sharon, Enon, Cedar, First Baptist Dillwyn, and Mulberry Grove totaled \$1,500.00. The balance on hand (12/31/21) was \$8,907.04.

MISSIONS (Rev. Jimmy Dunn, Chair) - Information was distributed on possibilities for Rise Against Hunger, 2022. Jimmy made a motion that JRBA send funds raised for RAH under their "Option II" (Local/Regional Procurement: Funds will be sent to in-country partners to procure food locally for those in need, thereby insuring the efficient distribution of food to hungry people and supporting the local economy as well). Betty Toney seconded the motion and it was approved. A discussion ensued on the appropriate due date for the 2022 RAH donation drive. Folks will be participating in the Hope for Appalachia shoebox drive in the next couple of months. It was noted that the Bland Ministry trip is set for May 15 - 22, 2022, and that contributions for that will be accepted through May 1. Gwynn Tyler made a motion that the due date for Rise Against Hunger Funds be July 31, 2022. It was seconded by Marilyn Snoddy and approved. Jimmy also emphasized the importance of the work being done in partnership with the Blue Ridge Food Ministry. He encouraged everyone to volunteer in this work. He also encouraged us to give to the BGAV Disaster Relief efforts and the spring Hope for Appalachia shoebox drive. He emphasized that with the recent storms and the resulting inconveniences we experienced, we should be even more caring and eager to support struggling people locally and around the world.

**MISSIONS BLITZ** (Rev. Michael Khol) - There was a ramp completed back in September. Recently, there had been some small jobs completed, one being putting sealer on the JRBA office roof. He is hopeful we can do large projects together again soon

**HOPE FOR APPALACHIA:** No report was given. Dates for the spring trip are not yet known nor has a due date been set for the receipt of Hope shoeboxes. A list of items needed in the 2022 shoeboxes was distributed (from the HFAVA website).

**PROGRAM** (Phyllis Tyler, Chair): The committee moved that a decision on holding the Semi-Annual Spring Meeting be postponed until the April Executive Board Meeting. The motion was approved.

#### OLD BUSINESS:

**HOPE FOR APPALACHIA**: Rev. Jimmy Dunn made a motion to "Re-Adopt" Bell Central Elementary for 2022. Betty Toney seconded the motion and it was approved. (No information is yet available on the number of boxes needed.)

#### NEW BUSINESS:

Rev. Michael Khol presented the **2022 Committee List** for approval. He noted that he had combined the Missions Blitz and the Missions Committee. The Revitalize Committee had been deleted. The Committee List was approved as presented.

News from the Ruth School in Romania:

2021 was exceptionally challenging for the entire world and especially for marginalized children in economically disadvantaged communities. Yet as we look back on a year marked by the COVID-19 pandemic, we see that we were able to provide hot meals for nearly 80 families during online learning periods; only one tablet of the 85 given out o Ruth School families was broken during online school; and we saw increased parental attendance to parenting courses....we look hopefully to the future in 2022...the after-school program will continue to provide additional tutoring for students to get up to and/or surpass their grade level curriculum...More than 40% of students in grades 1 -12 in Romania do not understand what they can read. The rate of this "functional illiteracy" is worse in socio-economically disadvantaged and rural communities. Public libraries are effectively non-existent in small cities and in villages. In the last 10 years more than 700 community libraries have been closed in Romania. For the past 5 years, Project Ruth has been partnering with rural schools to provide supplemental programming to more than 800 students on an annual basis. Yet literacy in these vulnerable minority groups has not improved.

In the fall, Project Ruth will be launching our "Reading Caravan" which will provide a mobile library with hundreds of exciting, agerelevant and appropriate books and reading comprehension software. Online software will allow students to log in and take a 10-question quiz on the book that they read. Their results will earn points for rewards from the Caravan. We hope to provide books to, ignite a passion for reading in, and evaluate the comprehension of more than 500 students who do not otherwise have access.

Looking forward to all the great things to come in 2022 and being able to reflect on the positives of 2021 would not be possible without your steadfast support. Your sponsorship dollars have been stretched and transformed into support for our students in ways that we never could have envisioned: take-out meal containers for hot lunches, family hygiene kits, at-home school supply kits, Internet hot spots for multi-child households to connect safely to online school, etc.

Victoria, your sponsored student, is once again back to learning in the classrooms at the Ruth School where we hope she will be every school day of 2022! Thank you once again for your unwavering support during these uncertain times.






