CHURCH OUTREACH

ANTIOCH (SCOTTSVILLE): During December, we had a very busy month with several Christmas events/outreach including the Joyful Noise celebration (traditional hymn song fest and fellowship), Women's Christmas Celebration (Meal, games, and secret Santa), Christmas Program performances in two services, Loaves and Fish Ministry Meal with distribution of food boxes including turkey and ham, and breakfast was delivered to the teachers and staff at Scottsville Elementary School. Additionally funds were collected and dispersed to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering.

ANTIOCH UNION: An estimated 170 people attended the outdoor nativity, The Message of Christmas, on December 2nd and 3rd. About 25 church members participated in the event.

BUCKINGHAM: Food boxes were delivered to all 15 residents of Gold Hill Village. Those who made the deliveries were so blessed by the experience and the recipients were very grateful. Five residents of Heritage Hall with little family (selected from the Angel Tree) received gifts. A Candlelight Service was held on Christmas Eve. (Hoping to have a Movie night in January - TBA).

CEDAR: On Sunday, December 4th, a group of Cedar folks went Christmas Caroling. The smiles on the faces of the ones visited was such a blessing for everyone. On Sunday, December 11th, the Youth presented the Christmas program, *Just a Little Christmas*. The folks at Cedar are so thankful for their young people and especially for the adults that take the time to work with them. Through the generosity of the church family, the Women on Mission were blessed to be able to provide Christmas gifts for 5 families with a total of 10 children on their Angel Tree.

CHESTNUT GROVE: Money was collected and requested items purchased for 3 Christmas families. One family was a 41-year old mother and two boys, ages 2 and 12. One couple was in their sixties. Another couple was in their eighties.

FIRST BAPITST DILLWYN: Christmas activities included the play, 365 Days of Christmas Each Year, which was presented to a full house on Sunday, December 11, and the Adult Choir's presentation of the Christmas Cantata, O Holy Night, on Wednesday, December 14, which was well attended and followed by refreshments. The children and youth, along with their leaders, prepared and rode on a float in the Dillwyn Christmas parade on Sunday, December 18. They also portrayed a live nativity scene with live animals on Sunday, December 4. FBC hosted the Red Cross Bloodmobile on December 14. The Sunday School classes at FBC are carrying out mission projects. Two of the classes have adopted families with special needs which they will seek to meet. Some FBC members sang Christmas carols for the residents of Heritage Hall on December 18. Helping Hands, a mission arm of FBC, continues to minister to many persons through a card ministry, visitation, and phone calls to many persons with special needs, providing financial help as needs arise, etc.

GLADSTONE MEMORIAL: The Christmas Program was held on December 18. The first Christmas concert was held with Jim and Suzanne Blaine, who were accompanied by several of their choir members from New Hope Baptist Church in Orange, VA. There were 51 in attendance. Everyone enjoyed a visit from Santa and refreshments!

JONES CHAPEL: A family (single parent with 5 children) was adopted through the Cumberland Christmas Mother program. Members and youth purchased gifts and other needed items for all 5 children and their dad. The Youth participated in Lights at the Lake (Bear Creek) and had a beautifully decorated display. The event raised money and gifts for the Christmas Mother program in Cumberland. On December 3, children gathered in the fellowship hall for a Christmas Extravaganza. They baked and decorated treats, heard stories, made ornaments, and practiced some caroling songs. The Jones Chapel congregation enjoyed a Christmas program on December 18. Savannah Skeens narrated the Christmas story while the children and youth performed. At the end of the program, the congregation was invited to sing along to *Joy to the World*. At the close of the service, Dennis Parker presented Pastor Dane and Marilyn with a gift from church members. On Dec. 31, the youth hosted a lock-in at the church to bring in the New Year.

MULBERRY GROVE: Gwynn Tyler will be joining a Mission Team from Liberty Baptist Church, Appomattox, traveling to assist with construction work in churches in Siguatepeque, Honduras, from January 20 – February 3.

SHARON: The congregation provided gifts of toiletry items for residents of Heritage Hall and made monetary donations to the Lottie Moon Christmas offering, GraceInside, and Christ in Christmas. Rose of Sharon WMU provided gifts to two area families to help lighten their load, and is continuing to visit with and deliver meals to sick or homebound. - Distribute Baby Bottle Banks to each household on the start date of your drive.
- 5. Remind participatns of the drive throughout the collection period.

 - o Call the PSC contact to pick up the Baby Bottle Banks with the donations in them.
 - OR count the money (cash) and the church can write a check for that amount to the Pregnancy Support Center and submit individual checks payable to PSC. (And PSC can arrange pickup of the used bottles.)


