JRBA QUARTERLY EXECUTUVE BOARD MEETING

January 9, 2023

Marilyn Snoddy, Moderator, opened the JRBA Quarterly Executive Board Meeting with a short devotional based on Habakkuk 3:2. Lord, I have heard of our fame; I stand in awe of your deeds, O Lord. Renew them in our day, in our time make them known; in wrath remember mercy. Marilyn noted that she grew up in a family that loved to sing so she is always thinking about music. From a book on the origin of hymns, she chose the hymn, Revive Us Again, by Dr. William MacKay. She thought about how we do not only need to be revived at Homecomings and Revival Services, but rather on a daily basis. Dr. MacKay was raised by a mother who loved the Lord - she prayed for him and taught him, and he accepted the Lord. When he graduated from high school, she gave him a Bible in which she wrote his name and a verse of Scripture. He studied medicine at the University of Edinburgh, but as time went on he drifted further and further from the way he was raised. At a particularly low point in his life, he even pawned the Bible his mother had given him. After medical school, MacKay worked in a hospital emergency room and became acquainted with human suffering. One day he encountered a badly injured man in serious condition who could not be helped. He asked him who he should notify. The man replied that he did not have anyone but a landlady whom he owed a debt. He wanted her to come so he could pay her and bring him his book. She did and the patient seemed to find comfort in the book. Dr. MacKay noticed a calm expression on the young man's face and guessed that he was a Christian. After the young man died, Dr. MacKay was given the book to dispose of. When he opened it, he found that it was the Bible his own mother had inscribed and given him! He thought about how the book had brought the man solace. Dr. MacKay began to read the scripture verses he had learned as a child and asked God to forgive him and to renew him to the joy of his salvation. Soon after that he wrote the words to Revive Us Again. He quit the medical profession, went to seminary, and became a pastor. Marilyn noted that, like Dr. MacKay, each of us needs to be renewed daily as we strive to serve our Lord. She then led us in the last verse of the hymn: Revive Us again, fill each heart with thy love; May each soul be rekindled with fire from above. Hallelujah, thine the glory; Hallelujah, amen. Hallelujah, thine the glory. Revive us again. Marilyn then led us in prayer. She then called the meeting to order.

Gwynn Tyler had the roll call of churches. There were 22 in attendance representing 11 churches. The minutes of the October 2022 Executive Board Meeting were presented and approved. The minutes of the Annual Fall Meeting were presented and approved.

Rev. Austin Williams, Treasurer, presented the Quarterly Treasurer's Report. As of 12/31/22, the checking account balance was \$31,345.22, which includes the following: Additional Missions - \$900, Mission Trips - \$2,250, Rise Against Hunger - \$871.99, Missions Blitz - \$898.52, Bland Ministries - \$500, Christian Education/Training/Evangelism - \$500, and Baccalaureates - \$600.

Education/ iraining/Evangeiism - \$500, and Baccalaureates - \$600. Total Receipts for the quarter totaled \$5,562.76, which included donations from JRBA Churches of \$5,177, Amazonsmile.com - \$9.55, Interest on checking - \$4.22, and Rise Against Hunger donations of \$371.99. Disbursements totaled \$7,020.84 including Mission Trips - \$250, Additional Missions (Pregnancy Center, Baptist Collegiate Ministry, Grace Inside, The Gideons, South Central VA Fellowship of Christian Athletes, BGAV Disaster Relief and Piedmont Habitat for Humanity) - \$1,356. Each of these organizations received \$100 per the budget and Disaster Relief received an additional \$656 from the designated Fall Meeting offering.

The Treasurer's Report was approved as presented. Austin also included in the packets a report of the Budget vs. Actual 1st quarter expenditures, outlining Line Items expenditures to date with remaining funds available. The report was approved as presented.

Marilyn then gave her Moderator's Report, noting the pastoral changes during the past quarter and introducing new pastors in attendance: Rev. Dane Gressett (Jones Chapel) and his wife, Marilyn, Rev. Steve Emory (Fitzgerald Memorial) and his wife, Kenita, and Rev. Austin Williams (Mulberry Grove). She noted the retirement of Rev. Henry Enochs (Goshen) and the recent ordination of Rev. D. J. Carter, Associate Pastor (Antioch - Scottsville) and Rev. Jenny Casell-Faulkner, Youth Pastor (Antioch - Scottsville). Marilyn thanked everyone for their generous response to the Fall Warm Clothing Drive for Hope for Appalachia. Rev. Woody Moore also expressed appreciation for all that was done and noted that because of our generosity, his team was able to give out coats, hats, and gloves to Pre-K and K students at an additional school. Marilyn thanked Rev. Jimmy Dunn for his service as Missions Chair and to Rev. Austin Williams for his Technology Support for the JRBA office in recent weeks. Jimmy noted that serving as Missions Chair had been an enjoyable experience and encouraged JRBA to keep moving forward to meet needs and to continue to give to Rise Against Hunger, Lottie Moon, and other mission efforts. Marilyn then reminded pastors of the upcoming Preaching Conference scheduled for March and encouraged them to participate.

OTHER OFFICERS' REPORTS:

<u>Baptist Collegiate Ministry</u>: Austin noted the appreciation of Longwood/Hampden Sydney BCM for our support. He will continue as part-time director through the spring semester.

<u>WMU</u>: Betty Toney encouraged everyone to continue to give to Rise Against Hunger and Lottie Moon. She also reminded us of the "Baby Bottle Drive" to raise funds for the Southside Pregnancy Center. The center will provide the bottles.

<u>Sunday School</u>: Rev. Jimmy Dunn noted that often Sunday School is seen as the "stepchild" in our churches. He encouraged us to take it seriously in 2023 and to make it a top priority. People need to get an understanding of God's Word and SS is the place to teach the Word with Christ at the center of that teaching. He suggested that those who attend SS should contact prospects who only attend worship, get to know people, and get people involved through fellowship and mission projects for each class.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Benevolence: Betty Toney, Chair, presented the Benevolence quarterly report. From October 1 – December 31, 2022, Disbursements totaled \$1,181.10. This included assisting two families with overdue electric bills, assisted three families who had lost everything in home fires, and a Memorial Gift to Hope for Appalachia in memory of Christin Moore, Rev. Woody Moore's mother. Contributions included \$300 from Cedar Baptist and \$200 from Sharon Baptist. The balance on hand is \$11,072.28. The report was approved.

<u>Missions</u>: Rev. Jimmy Dunn reminded folks of the great ministry of the Blue Ridge Food Distribution at Crystal Cathedral on the 2^{nd} and 4^{th} Fridays each month and encouraged everyone to volunteer. He noted that Nancy Wolfe is now in charge of this effort.

Hope for Appalachia: Rev. Woody Moore talked about the success of the emergency trip after flooding to deliver needed supplies, the Fall Trip to deliver warm clothing, and the upcoming Spring Trip to deliver Boxes of Hope to the schools, and again thanked everyone for their contributions and prayers. He noted that there were 99 professions of faith during the Fall trip! He encouraged everyone to follow the new lists carefully in preparing boxes and noted that small Bibles can be included or larger Bibles donated (separately) for those who make a profession of faith. (Updated lists and labels were included in the meeting packet.) He also noted that volunteers are still needed for the trip, March 27 – April 1). One can apply online (*prior to Feb. 22*) and must get a background check. If anyone is interested in being a part of his team, they should contact him as soon as possible.

OLD BUSINESS:

<u>Technology Update</u>: Rev. Austin Williams noted that a new HP Pavilion desktop computer has been purchased and installed. He also asked everyone to go to the JRBA website and check the information


listed for your church. Please let him know if there are any updates that need to be added/changed, especially the times of your services. YOUTH RETREAT: Austin noted the attendance of 27 youth from JRBA (Antioch-Scottsville and Mulberry Grove) at the CrossRoads Youth Retreat. It was a great experience and he encouraged churches to send their youth to the CrossRoads camp in the summer and to plan now to have them attend the Youth Retreat next January. Hope for Appalachia: A motion was made, seconded, and approved to re-adopt Bell Central Elementary School, in Kentucky, for 2023.

Committees: Marilyn presented the JRBA Committees for 2023. She asked that if anyone wanted to volunteer to serve on them to let her know so that they could be added. She would also like to have a Missions Co-Chair from Cumberland. The list (as presented) was approved. Rev. Woody Moore noted that since we no longer have anyone to head up Missions Blitz, folks should notify him if any needs arise.

<u>Technology</u>: Austin noted that there has been problems with the office copier resulting in the January newsletter only being available online. A technician from Sharp Business Machines came out and evaluated the printer's problems. They have cancelled out Maintenance Agreement since they cannot get the parts needed to repair the copier. Austin purchased the parts and installed them and the copier is currently working, but he noted that we will now have to buy the toners and if (when) other problems arise, he cannot diagnose the issue. Sharp has given us some quotes on four different copiers that would do an equivalent or better job for us. (Quotes were distributed in the packet.) Austin presented 3 options for proceeding: Do nothing - table this until the copier breaks again; Purchase new copier; Approve funds for purchasing a copier and proceed when the copier breaks down. After some discussion, a motion was made, seconded, and approved to set aside \$5,000 for the purchase of a new larger copier which also does color. (The estimated quote, with a maintenance agreement, is \$4,150.05, including the trade-in of the current copier. Color copies would be at an additional cost of 6¢ per copy.) It was noted that newsletters would not be done in color - that color would only be used for special items. Phyllis also noted that when the current copier was purchased in 2018, the entire cost was covered by donations from churches and individuals. Designated contributions will be welcomed. Meet 'n Greet Luncheon: JRBA is planning to host a Meet 'n Greet with Dr. Wayne Faison, the new BGAV Executive Director, in the near future. A date has been requested. Watch the newsletter for information.

A few announcements were made, a motion was made and seconded to adjourn and Rev. Woody Moore closed the meeting with prayer.
