

BGAV DISASTER RESPONSE - MOROCCO

After a 6.8 magnitude earthquake struck in Morocco, killing over 2,400 and damaging countless homes, rescue teams are working with Moroccan officials to coordinate an ongoing response. Because of the challenges of such a complex response, officials have limited access so the response can be well-coordinated. At this time, volunteers from the U.S. will not be part of the response.
