FITZGERAL MEMORIAL: Items have been collected for the Mully Family Center in Kenya: glasses, sunglasses, toothbrushes, and other dental products.

MT. ZION: Toothbrushes, reading glasses, and sunglasses are being collected for the WMUV medical mission trip to Mully's children in Kenya. The WMU will be meeting for lunch at Rodeos to celebrate "Love Month" (as Sallie Mowbray used to call February), and sending Valentines to the widows, widowers, couples who have been dealing with illnesses, and the 60 residents of Heritage Hall Nursing Home. Each card will include scripture. The cards are spreading the Love of God to 134 people of our area. The sewing ministry has switched to knitting and have made 315 dishrags to give to the teachers and staff at all 5 schools in Buckingham. That's a whole lot of "LOVE" stitches!

FIRST BAPTIST DILLWYN: Christy Palmore Davis will be going with others of our area on a mission trip to Liberia (Feb. 1 - 12). Part of their work will be with children. Helping Hands recently gave disposable diapers to the local Pregnancy Center; HOPE boxes are being filled during February; gas and food gift cards ae being given to people in need; and visits, cards, and prayers are being extended to people who are sick, bereaved ,and lonely.

MULBERRY GROVE: The church sent \$500 to JRBA for the Bland Ministry Center. The WMU recently provided 13 meals to a member family recovering from injuries sustained in an automobile accident. A love offering is being taken for Alex Poole who suffered a massive stroke. A "Blessing Box" is being prepared for a young person awaiting transplant surgery. Members are currently working on HOPE boxes for Kentucky. Flowers were sent to an injured member. Members plan to provide a meal for the Longwood BCM. Gwynn Tyler is currently serving on a Mission Team in Honduras.

JRBA Quarterly Executive Board Meeting January 8, 2024

Marilyn Snoddy, Moderator, opened the JRBA Quarterly Executive Board Meeting with a devotional on Psalm 24, the basis of the hymn, The King of Glory Comes. She talked about how everything in the world belongs to God and because of His Glory, the only appropriate response is to bow in submission to Him. God only asks that we fear Him, love Him, worship Him and walk in His ways...for our own good. We belong to Him. We must strive to have clean hands and hearts, to be clean inside and out. We accomplish this continuous cleaning by repenting. During the Covid pandemic, everyone learned the importance of washing our hands and people did so more than at any other time. We need to repent in the same way and just as often! What is false should not appeal to us - our world has so many false gods and beliefs. We have given in to false things of the world because they are appealing, looking good to the eyes and flesh, and we have gone along with the crowd. We have failed to fear God - The one true God - The King of Glory. King David called for the gates of the Holy city to be opened for the triumphant procession of the King of Glory, the Lord Almighty - this may have been when King David was returning from battle with the Ark of the Covenant (considered the Lord's Throne). Above the ark, it said, "Divine King...the Lord of Armies...who was mighty in battle. The victory was Israel's because of the King of Glory! One day the Messiah will come again and defeat his enemies in the tribulations and establish his millennial kingdom! Marilyn led everyone in singing, The King of Glory Comes. She then led in prayer and called the meeting to order.

Gwynn Tyler did the roll call of churches. There were 19 in attendance, representing 11 JRBA churches, with one visitor. The minutes of the October 2023 Executive Board meeting were presented and approved. The minutes of the Annual Fall Meeting, held on October 19, 2023, at Mulberry Grove, were presented and approved. The Treasurer's Quarterly Report was presented by Rev. Austin Williams, Treasurer. As of December 31, 2023, available funds totaled \$23,987.06, with one outstanding check (\$376.51). This total includes the following: Additional Missions Fund - \$100.00, Mission Trips -\$1,850.00, Rise Against Hunger - \$225.00, Missions Blitz - \$648.52, Bland Ministries - \$500.00, Christian Education/Training/Evangelism -\$300.00, and Baccalaureates - \$450.00. Total receipts for the past quarter totaled \$7,701.47, which included donations from JRBA churches - \$6,333.25, Individuals - \$1,140.00(including the Fall Meeting Offering), Interest on checking - \$3,22, and Rise Against Hunger donations of \$225.00. Total Disbursements totaled \$4,706.71, which included: Mission Trips (Woody Moore, Wayne Gough, & Linda Gough – HOPE Fall Trip) - \$150.00, Additional Missions (Pregnancy Support Center, Baptist Collegiate Ministry, Grace Inside, South Central VA Fellowship of Chrisitan Athletes) - \$100 each = \$400.00. The Savings Account Balance on December 31, 2023, was \$10,303.64. Also included in the packet was the 1st guarter budget vs. actual expenditures. Of the \$28,618.52 budgeted amount, \$23,636.81 remains. Austin also presented the quarterly report for the Knights' Pantry Fund. Available funds as of December 31, 2023, totaled \$2,541.23. Receipts of \$309.31 came in during the quarter, including \$124 from the churches and \$185 from individuals. The account made \$0.31 in interest. All of the Treasurer's reports were approved as presented.

Next, Marilyn Snoddy gave the Moderator's report. She noted the great response to our 2023 Rise Against Hunger Meal-Packing event held on October 15, 2023, A large number of folks came out to pack meals for a great time of fellowship and working together to feed hungry people. She mentioned that the Annual Fall meeting hosted by Mulberry Grove had good music, singing, and preaching! It is always good to see everyone and have fellowship. The Hope for Appalachia fall trip was a great success. Hats, coats, gloves, and other things

were delivered, along with packed bags for the Belle Central School Kindergarten and Pre-K students, bringing smiles to their little faces! She thanked everyone for accepting positions on JRBA committees for 2024 as we work together to keep the association serving the Lord. She noted the great time spent at the BGAV Annual Meeting celebrating its 200th Anniversary. She encouraged anyone with the opportunity to attend in the future. She is hopeful that in 2024 we will be able to do all the Lord has for us, accomplishing much with the help of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Rev. Skip Wallace, Field Strategist for the Central/Valley Region, spoke about the upcoming Preaching Conference, sponsored by the Augusta Association and BGAV. It will be held March 10 - 12 at Eagle Eyrie Conference Center. He encouraged our pastors to attend for a great time of rest and rejuvenation. The fee of \$225 covers lodging and meals. If you plan to drive back and forth, the fee is \$95 for your meals. If anyone does not have the funds to attend, please contact him. He also noted that a Digital Proficiency Workshop will be held in Charlottesville on February 28, at Spring Hill Baptist from 10 AM - 2 PM, with lunch included. Your church's web presence will be evaluated. Pastors and/or media person should attend. More info will soon be coming out. It will most likely be free of charge.

Woody has a couple of videos and is working on a slide presentation which he would be happy to share if a church would like him to come. 
