SEASON OF LENT

February 14 - March 28, 2024

Lent is an incredibly historical and symbolic time for Christians. It is the liturgical season that prepares us for Christ's death and resurrection. In this season of penitential preparation, we turn our hearts and minds to God through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Lent is observed for 40 days because Christ suffered and was tempted in the desert for 40 days and nights. It is a direct reflection of the days that eventually led up to his crucifixion. It begins on Ash Wednesday (a holiday that is observed for the sake of recognizing our faults as human beings, and taking the time to repent for the sins we have committed). At Ash Wednesday services, a cross is made from ashes and placed on one's forehead as a visible sign of repentance.

- 1. PRAYER: Individuals are encouraged to reflect on their relationship with God and to seek a deeper spiritual connection with Him.
- 2. FASTING: This practice involves giving up certain luxuries or desires for a period of time in order to focus on spiritual needs. The purpose of fasting is to help individuals draw closer to God by acknowledging their dependence on God and breaking away from worldly distractions.
 Examples: Give up a certain food or social media: refrain from negative thoughts or gossiping, etc.
 - ALMSGIVING: This involves helping those in need. It is an expression of love and compassion. It helps individuals to focus on their obligations to others and to living a life of selflessness and service.

Examples: Donating to a charity, volunteering time at a local food distribution, or helping a neighbor in need. NEW traditions also include "adding" things to your life such as setting aside time to meditate and pray each day, visiting shut-ins, and participating in community service projects.

Through each of these practices, Christians can grow spiritually, more readily appreciate the suffering of our Lord, and to rejoice in His Resurrection!


Thursday, March 28

Good Friday is the day in which Christians commemorate the crucifixion and death of Jesus Christ.






